#### **Sample Questions**

#### Workflow Focused Questions:

- "Describe the steps involved in a typical workflow when an asset is approved in Workfront and needs to be used in AEM." They want to see if you know how the integration works from start to finish.
- "What could go wrong with the workflow and how would you troubleshoot that?" The
  people who set the exam want to know that you understand how to deal with
  problems.

#### Technical Stuff:

- "What are the necessary steps in configuring the AEM Workfront connector for optimal performance?" This is all about the set up, and how to do it the right way.
- "Where would you look for logs to diagnose problems between the integration?" When things break it's not the end of the world but you need to know where to find the information.

#### Sample Interview Questions

- "Walk me through your experience of setting up the Workfront to Experience Manager connector." It's not just about what you know, but what you've *done*.
- "Tell me about a time when you had to troubleshoot a complex issue with the Workfront and Experience Manager integration and what was your approach?"
- "How do you ensure the data integrity between Workfront and AEM when they are talking to each other?" This is a big one, they need to know that the data is accurate.
- "What strategies would you use to optimize this integration for better overall business performance?" They want to see how you think, and how you can get the integration to do its job to the max.

#### Tips and Tricks (From a Friend)

• Hands-On Experience is Gold: If you have access to both tools, play around! Get your

hands dirty. There is no replacement for the hands-on time.

- The Documentation is Your Friend: Yes, it can be dry, but it's where all the answers are.
- **Join Online Communities:** There are others out there who are on the same path. Don't be afraid to ask for help or share what you have learned.
- Practice, Practice: The more you practice with sample and practice questions, the better you will do.

#### What Now?

Look, this isn't a sprint, it's more like a marathon. You've got to pace yourself, do the work, and not be afraid to ask for help.
